Home tasks to support learning:

In **PSHE** we will be learning about 'Getting on and falling out'. Think about the behaviours we would see in school and other social settings.


Science: States of matter Key vocabulary to know:

Solids - These materials keep their shape unless a force is applied to them. Liquids - take the shape of their container. They can change shape but do not change the amount of space they take up.

Gases - can spread out to completely fill the container or room they are in. Water vapour - this water takes the form of a gas.

Melt - when a solid changes to a liquid. Freeze - A liquid turns to a solid during the freezing process.

Evaporate - Turn a liquid into a gas. Condense - Turn a gas into a liquid.



History – Anglo-Saxons and Vikings Key vocabulary to know:

Chronology – the arrangements of dates or events in the order of their occurrence

Society – a community of people living together

Religion – the belief in and worship of a God or Gods

Technology – applying scientific knowledge for practical purposes Influential people – someone whose actions or opinions strongly influence the course of events

Transport – to take or carry people or goods from one place to another by means of a vehicle, aircraft or ship Settlement – a place where previously had been uninhabited

Invaders – A person or group that conquers a country, region or place Traders – a person who buys and sells goods

Archaeologist – a person who studies human history through the excavation of sites and other physical remains

English:
