




Y6 Autumn 1 Information Organiser

Try throwing a large ball with one hand and then with both hands in a chest pass.</p> <p>Try jumping from one foot to the other foot, one foot to two feet and two feet to one foot.</p>  <p>To support the Computing topic, practise using search engines to find information.</p> <p>In PSHE, we will be learning about rights and responsibilities at home, school and in the wider society.</p> 	<p>Science: Living Things</p> <p>Carl Linnaeus – known as the ‘father of taxonomy’ by creating a system of naming plants and animals.</p> <p>Taxonomy – the scientific study of naming and classifying groups of organisms based on shared characteristics.</p> <p>Classification – arranging into groups based on similar characteristics.</p> <p>Organism – an individual animal, plant or single-celled life form.</p> <p>Microorganism – an organism of microscopic size.</p> <p>Vertebrate – an animal with a backbone.</p> <p>Invertebrate – an animal without a backbone.</p> <p>Species – a group of organisms which can biologically reproduce.</p> <p>Kingdom, Phylum, Class, Order, Family, Genus, Species</p>	<p>History: Britain Since 1930s.</p> <p>dictator – a ruler with total power over a country.</p> <p>persecution – to treat someone unfairly or cruelly over a long period of time because of their race, religion or political beliefs.</p> <p>anti-Semitism – hatred of Jews.</p> <p>propaganda – information, especially misleading or biased, used to promote a political point of view.</p> <p>Kindertransport – the rescue mission which took thousands of children to safety ahead of World War 2.</p> <p>evacuation – the process of moving people away from an area where they are in danger to a safer area.</p> <p>ration – a limited amount of something that one person is allowed.</p> <p>air raid – an attack in which bombs are dropped from aircraft on to a ground target.</p>
