

English:

Science: Light

sclera – the white of the eye retina – tissue at the back of the eye optic nerve – sends messages from retina to brain

lens – focuses light rays onto the retina iris – the coloured part of the eye pupil – allows light to pass to the retina refraction – the bending of light as it changes speed

spectrum - a band of colours separated
according to wavelength

reflection – the bouncing of light off a surface



History: Britain Since 1930s.

dictator – a ruler with total power over a country.

persecution – to treat someone unfairly or cruelly over a long period of time because of their race, religion or political beliefs.

anti-Semitism – hatred of Jews. propaganda – information, especially misleading or biased, used to promote a political point of view.

Kindertransport – the rescue mission which took thousands of children to safety ahead of World War 2.

evacuation – the process of moving people away from an area whey they are in danger to a safer area.

ration – a limited amount of something that one person is allowed.

air raid -an attack in which bombs are dropped from aircraft on to a ground target.
