Science: Evolution and Inheritance

inheritance – the passing on of genetic information from parents and ancestors. evolution – the process in which living organisms have changed over time. characteristics – a feature or quality belonging to a person.

genes – a genetic unit which determines some characteristics of a person. dominant – a gene which expresses itself more strongly.

recessive – a gene which is 'masked' by dominant genes.

offspring – a person's children or an animal's young.

natural selection – the process in which living things have become more suited to their environment.

ancestor – a person from whom a person is descended.


Geography- Natural Disasters

active volcano - a volcano which is either erupting or is likely to erupt in the future.

dormant volcano- a volcano that has not erupted in a long time but is expected to erupt again in the future tremor – shaking movement fault lines - a line on a rock surface or the ground that traces a geological fault.

tectonic plates - is a massive, irregularly shaped slab of solid rock destruction - the action or process of causing so much damage to something that it no longer exists or cannot be repaired

magnitude – the size or extent of something
