Home tasks to support learning:

water proof – keeps out water water resistant – able to keep out some water

chronological – time order past - a time before now

present – existing or happening now primary source – something which tells us original information from the time it occured

secondary source – evidence of history created by somebody after the event significant – important architect - a person who designs a building
